What is happening in the Labour Party?

The Labour Party has been beset, since Jeremy Corbyn's leadership win, by accusations of antisemitism. Some on the Left of the party have accused the right of cynically making up the existence of antisemitism in the party and have denied its existence.

On Guard believes that Antisemitism does exist in the labour party and in the wider labour movement, and that as a result, the right wing has been given ammunition against Corbyn's leadership unnecessarily. We should not leave the fight against antisemitism to the right wing.

What is Anti-Semitism?

- denying or minimising the Holocaust
- accusing people who complain about antisemitism of being in the pay of Israel
- holding Jews particularly responsible for the Israeli state's oppression of the Palestinians, or demanding that Jews renounce their identity and break links with Israel if they don't want to be called racist.
- denouncing 'Zionists' without any distinction between the many different Zionist viewpoints and without ever denouncing any other nationalism in similar terms
- promoting or making excuses for centuries-old antisemitic stereotypes or caricatures
- Indulging in conspiracy theories and fake news about Jews being capitalist exploiters

Where does it come from?

Jews have been persecuted for hundreds of years before the nazi death camps in 1940's Germany where 6 millon Jews were slaughtered.

Propaganda used to justify persecution

Jews fleeing the holocaust were turned away from European ports, including in Britain.

Our rulers have always used the myth of "the enemy within" to divide us. For centuries they used the Jews as a "useful enemy" in their propaganda. The caricature of the "rich Jew" was useful to take the heat off the real exploiters – aristocrats and capitalists.

But what about Israel and Palestine?

Israel was set up in 1948 as a result of the persecution of Jews. Zionism was an expression of the desire of Jews to have a safe homeland. Within the Zionist movement there were many different strands of thought from socialists to rightwing nationalists.

1948 war

In 1948 Arab states invaded Israel, intent on genocide. Their armies were led by British officers. Many Jews around the Middle East were driven by force to Israel. Israel responded with terrible brutality against Palestinians, which continues today.

Divided people

Israeli and Arab rulers have used war propaganda to divide their peoples and deflect blame from their own crimes ever since.

Socialists and pacifists in Israel work to resist the occupation. We should back them.

Both Israel and Palestine have a right to exist. Jews have a right to identify with Israel or not, as they choose.

What do we say?

On Guard supports a two-states solution with reparations paid to Palestine. Equal rights for equal peoples – to drain the swamp of hatred and racism. Solidarity not boycott: our unions should link up with trade unions in both Israel and Palestine to fight the occupation.

Carnage In May

It's clear that the introduction of yet more new services in May is likely to go just as terribly as last May. The company is introducing the hand-me-down 170s over some of our routes but is struggling to train the train crew to drive them.

The rumour is that the only reason those units are being moved over to the Sheffield/Doncaster/Hull patch is that the stop-start, low speed nature of the Harrogate route was knackering the transmissions - so why didn't the company know that would happen before they introduced them over there? Didn't they think they needed to speak to the Scotrail engineering dept for a few tips?

This cowboy outfit just piles disaster on top of disaster - now they're rushing to get train crew ready for the introduction of some already-knackered rolling stock and they're not going to manage.

May is going to be carnage, especially if ASLEF pulls Rest Day Working in April.

So, after 47 days of strike action carried out by the RMT to defend passenger safety, the company has expressed a willingness to accept that, for the duration of the current franchise, every train will have a conductor as well as a driver on board.

This is a significant shift from management, caused by the tenacious determination of the staff who hve fought so bravely for such a long time. Their move from 'second person' to 'conductor', in particular, could herald a collapse of the management's attack on the safety critical role being removed from the train.

However, many of us are sceptical of their intentions, and rightly so. Until we have it signed and delivered, we won't trust them an inch.

In negotiations, the company are going to want to try and play RMT and ASLEF off against each other but that shouldn't be possible; look, here's ASLEF policy on DOO/DCONo extension of DOO schemes or introduction of DOO in the form of DCO or any other name:

"All current DOO(P) schemes to be revisited and safety risk assessed with a policy of all trains having a second person who is trained and licensed at least to the standard required to carry out the duties of guard as detailed in the industry rule book".
